The Director of Medical Student Education in Radiology will have oversight of all aspects and categories of student exposure to radiology. It is expected that the Director will allocate up to 50% of their time to this activity, with the remaining 50% allocated to clinical radiology in their sub specialty. The Director of Medical Student Education will report to the Vice Chair of Education.

Specific responsibilities include:

- Responsibility for the new Radiology Selective
 - Develop curriculum and serve as Course Director for the new Radiology Selective
 - Coordinate with the global medical school curriculum
 - Synchronize with presentation of material presented elsewhere in the curriculum
 - Oversee Radiology Electives
 - Review and if necessary redesign all radiology electives
- All elective instructors will report to the Director Medical Student Education
- Recruitment, training and oversight of participating radiology faculty
- 'Teach-the-teacher': How to effectively use the Simulation Center, e-learning, interactive software, etc in teaching today's students.
- Design and oversee student mentoring program
- Serve as radiology liaison with Department of Education Informatics
- The C21 Curriculum anticipates 30% of didactic material to be web based.
- Develop a program to involve radiology house staff in the teaching mission
- Identify and oversee research opportunities for students in radiology
- Liaison with the Associate Dean of Curriculum
- Represent the Department on the SOM Curriculum Committee

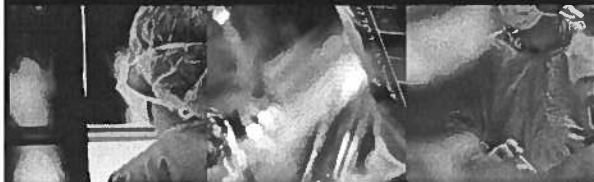
