AMSER Shared Educational Resources

A variety of useful educational resources are made available to AMSER members, thanks to the efforts of Petra Lewis, Nancy McNulty, Sravanthi Reddy, Kitt Shafer and the contributions of many members. Resources include:

Radiology ExamWeb: This online examination tool and database of medical student NBME style exam questions (currently >850) Is available to student educators to use on their clerkships/electives.

- Instructors can make their own exams from the database, or use ones developed by other instructors.
- All areas of radiology are covered and questions are categorized at four levels.
- Both image and non-image based questions
- · Students take exams on-line with automatic marking.
- An AMSER 'shelf exam' will be developed.
- Currently supported by an RSNA Education Grant and grants from the Hudson Foundation.

It is also a great place to publish: submit your educational resource to MedEdPORTAL and distribute it to the world. A wide variety of resources are accepted (see site for examples). You obtain a peer-reviewed NLM citation and can download statistics for your CV/teaching portfolio. Check out the ACER collection for useful resources for students on radiology rotations.
